

Santa Rosa Quilt Guild is proud to present Debbie Caffrey, guest speaker and teacher, August 20 and 21, 2015. Debbie is an author of many books, patterns, and freelance magazine articles. She has appeared on 'The Quilt Show' with Ricky Tims and Alex Anderson, 'Creative Living' with Sheryl Borden on select PBS networks, 'Quilters Coffee' and HGTV's 'Simply Quilts.'

At the Scottish Rite Center on Acacia Rd. Thursday, August, 20th beginning at 10:00 Debbie Caffrey will lecture on 'How to Have it All.' Please check out her website for more information on the lecture www.debbiescreativemoments.com. Her workshop is titled 'Power Cutting and Power Cutting,Too.' Registration opened June 4. The workshop will be held at the Luther Burbank Art and Garden Center, 2050 Yulupa Ave, August 21 from 9:00 am to 3:30 pm for only \$40.00. About the workshop: Power cutting is a fast and efficient approach to rotary cutting and improving the precision of quilt making. Efficient speaks to accuracy, economy of fabric, ergonomics, safety, and organization, as well as speeding the mundane process of cutting quilts. Power cutting is a collection of cutting techniques that allows quilters to choose one that is suited for the task at hand. For instance, making a few large half-square triangle units for a quilt should employ a different approach than making many small units. Learn to decide upon a plan of attack. This workshop begins with the basics of preparing and handling fabric, using rotary cutting tools, how to hold a ruler so that it doesn't slip, why strips sometimes look like rickrack and quickly goes well beyond the basics of cutting your fabric.

Technique Sharing Workshops

Thank you to everyone who has shared a technique this year. Genelle's pin cushion was charming. Jim Jensen patiently showed us a quilt as you go technique from Leah Day.

Technique Sharing Workshops are free to all Guild members and start after the meeting. On August 20th Diana Roberts will do a technique sharing of edges for quilts other than a traditional binding. This is a demo only with examples and explanations.

32" x 40" Baby Quilts	For Sutter & Memorial NICUs, Public Health nursing, & teen moms. We provide kits for making the tops, or you may use your own fabrics.	
40" x 60"	For Valley of the Moon and other organizations serving children in need. Please use bright colors for young children or fabrics that will appeal to teenagers.	
50" x 65"	For 18 year olds aging out of the Foster Care system and for women residing at the YWCA Safe House.	
40" x 60"	Lap quilts for adults. Given to Secret Santa, women being served by Verity, deserving seniors in local convalescent hospitals, & others.	
Doll Quilts	For little girls & boys. We collect them throughout the year and donate during the holidays.



Grandma lets you help her use the cereal box cardboard templates to cut out these precious pieces of gold and shows you

how to sew them together by hand. Then Grandma has the nerve to take all those beautiful scraps with her when she leaves. Your mom is not much help; she doesn't like to sew. What's a girl to do? Great idea ... go around to the neighbors and beg for scraps! Oh, oh ... Mom finds out, is totally embarrassed, and there goes your budding quilt calling.

Sue Gragg treasures the memory of learning to quilt by her Grandma's apron. Despite her Mom's intercession, she discovered she could find scraps of fabric left over from her 6th grade Home Ec classes and make doll quilts and small quilts for kids in the neighborhood. Sue's love for "scrappy" continues today.

Her early fascination with all things fabric followed her

through life. Sue worked at knitting and fabric shops, and has taken many classes at the Santa Rosa Junior College, quilt shops and through the guild. She made her Mom a "Double Wedding Ring" by hand and has made several "Grandma's Flower Garden" hexie guilts. She loves hand work.

Sue developed her love of appliqué about 20 years ago and has taken many classes by experts like Nancy Brown and Sylvia Pippen. She prefers the "needleturn" method to fusing or freezer paper, and participates in a couple "mini-groups" including "The Fat Quarters" which meets at Village Sewing Center. She is inspired by other appliquérs, including SRQG members Vicki David, Raychell Sumner, and Helen Anderson. There is always something new to learn. Because she is fascinated by patterns that recreate images of animals and flowers, Sue enjoys finding fabrics that read well in small pieces. Sue has ap-

plied this talent to the "Bay Area Story Telling Book Festival" fundraising quilt for the past nine years.

Sue is getting great response as Chair of our Block of the Month program this year, and has included making sample settings to show how well these basic blocks come together as beautiful quilt tops.

SRQG provides Sue with constant inspiration. She enjoys being with fellow quilters who are upbeat and passionate about their craft, and is inspired by all the many artistic visions displayed by other members.

Sue separates her stash of UFO's into three categories – sometimes she will work on individual blocks and come back to visit later to add other blocks that coordinate (she has about 10 that meet that definition), others that are 50 – 60% complete, and five or so quilt tops are done but need to be quilted.

Besides her great work with Block of the Month, Sue is working on a major hexie project. Although she usually prefers the traditional and detailed, she bought herself a "tower" of fat quarters and is looking forward to making a "modern" quilt.

Sue has won many awards, but her favorite project was her cow, "Mazie of Sonoma County" which she finished for a Bishop Ranch challenge.

SRQG is very fortunate that Sue Gragg shares her time and talent with us. She is an excellent teacher and is quick to share her knowledge with anyone needing guidance ... her sunny personality continually shines a light wherever she channels her energy.
