### Sandra Bruce

August 18 & 19, 2016

Sandra is a quilt artist who lives in Grass Valley, CA and has been teaching and operating her own longarm business since 2010. She combines her love of lettering and illustration into her quilts and loves to incorporate writing into her quilting motifs. She is known for her portraits in fab-



ric and her use of color. "Material Matrix", which involves interpreting a gridded photograph with fabric is a process that is different than other gridded photograph methods in that it involves piecing and a loose, representational style inspired by the painter, Chuck Close.

Sandra will do a lecture and trunk show that showcases her work, her background, and the road that led lead her to develop her "material matrix" technique. She will also be talking about use of color.

### "Color Dance"

JAN SOULES October 20 & 21, 2016

Jan Soules has been quilting since 2000. She has never settled on one style, preferring to mix appliqué and pieced blocks using her sense of color and design to create her "treasures." Choosing colors and fabrics are her favorite part of the process and she carefully selects each piece in her so called "scrap" quilts. Her creativity continues to take her in different



directions. She has won many awards and had her quilts in AQS shows, PIQF, Road to California and the Hoffman Challenge traveling show.

She completed a course in judging and wearable art sponsored by the West Coast Quilt Judging Academy in 2012. Jan is a member of the Elk Grove and River City Quilt Guilds.

She is scheduled to be artist in residence at Empty Spools at Asilomar for session one in 2017.

# October 20 Program

"Spectacular Borders, from Basics to Beyond"

This lecture includes a discussion of various border treatments, with emphasis on what works and why. She will use her prize winning quilts to demonstrate the different border treatments and explain how you can turn an ordinary quilt top into an extraordinary one!

## October 21 Workshop

In this quilt you will large colorful make blocks from strip sets. You will learn how to make a template. There is no matching of seams required so you can be free to create your own unique work of art. Each quilt will be individual and unique treasure. The pattern can be adapted to any size quilt. You can stick with



a color theme or use a variety of colors and patterns. It is your creation so gather your fabrics and have some fun. This one is a great scrap buster!

# **Technique Sharing Workshops**

A BIG thank you to Sharon Fry for her TSW at the July 21<sup>st</sup> meeting called "Sew Simple Pineapples." Sharon is a lovely public speaker and quilter. Her parrot, Rosie, helps sort out her projects at home! (smile) Sharon's TSW had almost 40 members in attendance, and she had great samples of each stage of the block. Very informative! Some ladies seemed to be familiar with the "pineapple" block, but I was not and look forward to trying it!
