

Also, a thank you to Linda Silva for giving our guild the next-larger size of cutter and many dies that she won in a raffle. Reserve the machines and dies just like a library book. And don't forget that we have magazine subscriptions to:



On Mentoring

Sometime early this year we received a request from a high school student who was looking for a mentor to help her with an art project.

When I met Emma Kapi'olani Hughes early in March she told me she was in an advanced art program at Santa Rosa High School and she was to do a project that challenged her to do something she had never done before. She chose to make a quilt. Actually, she wanted to make a bed quilt and a landscape quilt by her final in May. At that meeting she had several books she had checked out from the library and was already researching how to make a quilt. She had a sewing machine that her grandmother had given her (although she had not used it) and was ready to go having little idea what might be involved.

Well, after some detailed (and realistic) discussion we settled on making a small quilt for a child in her extended family. I suggested she might want to use pre-cut strips for her first quilt and showed her some patterns and ideas for using color. She got right on the internet and found a pattern for free that she liked as well as a strip set of bright colors she thought the young boy would like.

At our next meeting I brought her some supplies (cutting mat, iron and pad for piecing). She had already purchased her rotary cutter and had other essential supplies. Chris Nolen donated "The Freshman Year" quilt book by Harriet Hargrave, which she planned to read cover to cover. We talked about how to read patterns, and how to go about the process of making the quilt. We practiced a little on her machine and it worked fine.....both for straight stitch and free motion. As with most young people she is very adept at using the internet and You Tube for information so she did not need much detailed help.

The next time I met with Emma she had her quilt finished. This is one very independent young lady, and very focused. Her mother told me her first words were "Emma Do." She loves all kinds of art and is accomplished at crochet, making jewelry, recycling and repurposing items, decoupage, painting, and I am sure there are others. She showed me some of her crafts and creations and they were impressive.

She is very excited that she will be spending a month this summer at NYU in New York in a special art program. She was a delight to work with and

40" x 60"	For Valley of the Moon and other organizations serving children in need. Please use bright colors for young children or fabrics that will appeal to teenagers.
50" x 65"	For 18 year olds aging out of the Foster Care system and for women residing at the YWCA Safe House.
40" x 60"	Lap quilts for adults. Given to Secret Santa, women being served by Verity, seniors in local convalescent hospitals, & others.
Doll Quilts	For little girls & boys. We collect them throughout the year and donate during the holidays.




There are many kits available if you prefer to sew without much fuss. Pick them up and turn them in to me at any meeting. Deadline is November 1st.

Sonoma County Fair

The Sonoma County Fair runs from August 2nd through August 12th. The theme this year is "Salute to Heroes." You can pick up an Exhibitor's Guidebook at our guild meetings, at any Sonoma County library or at the Fair office at the fairgrounds. Entries are accepted only online and close June 30th. There is a \$2.00 entry fee per quilt. You will receive one free admission pass when you deliver your quilts on July 16th, 12:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Santa Rosa Quilt Guild awards the Best Hand Quilted quilt with a Rosette and \$50.00. We also give a \$25.00 Award and Rosette to the Best Use of Color and Design quilt in the Youth Home Arts Department. If you know a young quilter, you should encourage him or her to enter. There is a Quilt Square Challenge, finished size 12.5" X 12.5" with the theme, "Salute to Heroes."



Each year at the fair, quilters are invited to demonstrate their art along with needle workers, spinners, weavers and hookers (rugs that is!!). There are two three-hour shifts, for two quilters each, every day. A free pass to the fair is awarded to each participant. It's really a fun experience. Two machines are provided and there will be baby quilt kits to sew for the neonatal intensive care units in Sonoma County. Or you can bring your own project to work on. Sign up with a friend or make a new quilting buddy. The room is filled with crafts to explore and the quilts hanging from the walls and rafters make a wonderful environment in which to show off our craft to the public. The sign-up sheet will be at all meetings between now and the end of the fair.

STORING QUILTS & MAKING QUILT BAGS


