She will be teaching participants how to make triangles with perfect points without ever cutting a square. The project will include making a table runner. Just think you could make a class project that you can give as a Christmas gift. You can make several seasonal table runners or add to the one gift by adding matching napkins or a candle holder with a candle or a small vase with flowers or a small picture frame with a picture of the recipient's grandchild(ren) just to name a few ideas!

The workshop for August is with Cindy Needham who will be teaching what to do with "those" linens; even those with stains and worn spots! You know which ones to which I am referring! Those are the tablecloths, doilies, pillowcases that have taken space but you haven't used yet you've always wanted to do something with them! Once again, this opportunity allows you to learn a new technique with items you already have and can present as family Christmas gifts. "This lovely guilt is Mom's table cloth that she used every Thanksgiving. "

Carol highlights the 40 years since the three surgeries that "broke my body, nearly crushed my spirit, and forever changed my life." At the age of 17, Carol had reached a height of 6'6". With the intention of giving her a "normal life," a doctor surgically shortened her six inches. On Saturday, August 8, 2 p.m., Carol Larson will present a slide show lecture about the quilts she created that reflect the physical pain, the emotional scars, and the spiritual healing that followed the surgery. fifth thursday retreat

Thursday, July 30th at 10:30 am at the Luther Burbank Art & Garden Center, Tera Antaree will show all interested how to create baby quilt tops out of flannel scraps. I'll bring all the flannel scraps and teach how to make two styles – "wonky log cabins" and "squares" (depending on the size of the scraps). Bring your sewing machine, good medium- or large-size scissors (I like my Clover serrated edge ones), a 12-1/2" square ruler (if you have one, for log cabins), 6" or 6-1/2" wide ruler (for squares), and any flannel scraps you'd like to find coordinating fabrics for. These cute baby quilts are really fun and fast, require very little preparation or space, and mostly involve sewing (my favorite part)! See you then!
