PROGRAM JANUARY 17, 2013 ~ "LAUREL'S SEARCH FOR PERFECT APPLIQUE"

Laurel Anderson comes from a long line of gifted textile artisans. They called themselves housewives. Her mother taught her to sew when she was a young child. Laurel loves hand and machine applique and prefers natural landscapes that include flowers, trees and mountains. She is best known for her complimentary mix of color, pattern and texture. Laurel has shown her quilts in the Contra Costa and River City Guild shows, also at PIQF and in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. She has won Best of Show, First Place and Best Use of Color and Viewer's Choice awards. Whisper Color describes the technique Laurel uses to dye silk scarves, thus her company name was born. Laurel was born and raised on the West Coast.

Learn to use a wide variety of applique shortcuts, notions and products in this fun class. Mix and match your favorite methods to finish your own beautiful Whisper of Spring quilt. Make perfect points and circles using Laurel's techniques. Make a pitcher out of layers of tulle, and if desired add beads to look like rain drops. Complete the quilt top in sections or as a whole scene, choosing your favorite seasonal colors. See calendar for more information on the workshop.

Her workshop is called "Fabulous Flowers – Fast, Fun, Fused. You will learn her easy techniques for producing floral quilts with oversized images. You will use an original flower



drawing (20" X 23" provided by the instructor (\$10 fee). You will have seven flower choices: Poppy, Rose, Sunflower, Daylily, Calla Lily, Iris, and Bird of Paradise. Block of the Month

As the new co-chairs of the Block of the Month, we first will say a big "thank you" to Joyce Wood and Veline Ball for last year's adventures with the "Log Cabin." It was fun to discover the variations of this versatile pattern, and we received a good response. Again, our thanks go to Joyce and Veline.

Our theme for 2013 will be "Never Enough Nine Patch." Just like "Log Cabin," there are endless variations to explore. January starts off with the classic "Double 9 Patch."

We've made a of couple changes to the program this year. First, the directions for all blocks will request the use of **white tone on tone** for the background, thus giving the blocks continuity throughout the year.

Second, with that continuity in mind, we strongly suggest that you make a second block for yourself in your own chosen color scheme, so at the end of the year, you will have the blocks to make a sampler quilt.

Third, we have changed the schedule for holiday blocks so that, by the time the holiday has arrived, you will have had the chance to finish the top. Therefore, January's block will be a green and white combination in honor of St. Patrick's Day in March.

We're excited about exploring the versatile "Nine Patch," and hope you will join us on our journey.

Wearing your nametag is a huge help to everyone. This is an excellent way for us to get to know each other.



Friendship Blocks

I was so amazed at how many Friendship Blocks (FB) came in during 2013 that I decided to continue as coordinator for 2013! Block requests will continue to be introduced by email, accompanied by instructions/patterns, and will also be announced at the meetings. You may sign up by email, or at meetings, or by phone. Elaine Tucker will put block request information on our website, including download links for patterns/ instructions. Elaine also posts on the Guild website photographs of all blocks submitted, with the name of it's maker.

Explanation of program: The FB program is a "time release" block exchange - This means that every block you receive must be offset with a FB credit that you can acquire in one of the ways listed below (or, in other words, "there is no free lunch".) Anyone with at least 3 credits, may request up to 20 blocks to be made for them. Think of this as "borrowing" the other 17 credits from the bank so you can get your blocks early. If you actually receive 20 blocks, 3 of these are offset by your qualifying 3 credits - but you then OWE the bank the other 17 credits.

The ways in which you get credits: make a FB for someone else; make a block for the opportunity quilt; make a block for the President's gift.

There are quite a few members who have 20 or more credits; there are many more who are more than halfway to 20 credits; and there are hordes of members who have at least enough credits to qualify to make a request for blocks.

Three requests were introduced during the holidays: Sharon Fry's heart block, Pam Beebe's Sunbonnet Sue, and Rhonda Denny's pieced cat block. Gale Davis's beach bird block is also still open to signups.

At the January 3rd meeting I will have an updated FB credit list for members. Please check with me if you are not sure. If I can get the list updated in time, I will email it out through Sharon Fry.

Please don't hesitate to participate – either making blocks or requesting blocks. I am available to help get the block information down on paper, including patterns, templates, etc.

Technique Sharing Workshops

This is a way to use fabrics in your stash which no longer appeal – the fabrics that you look at and say to yourself "What was I thinking!" When they are cut into strips and crocheted, they are much more attractive.

Joyce Gross



Joyce Gross, renowned quilter and mentor for the Santa Rosa Quilt Guild passed away on December 24, 2012.

Joyce opened a quilt shop in Mill Valley, California in the 1960's and eventually began teaching quilting at Santa Rosa Junior College. Her students were so excited and enjoyed each other's company, so Joyce suggested that they keep meeting on their own after the class finished. The Santa Rosa Quilt Guild was founded in 1976, and the first meeting being held at Dotty Zagar's home with 15-20 people attending.

Joyce also founded Quilter's Journal in 1977, a magazine dedicated to quilt history. In 1980, she was a founding member of the American Quilt Study Group. For 20 years, from 1981 to 2001 she ran the Point Bonita Quilt Retreat. Joyce was inducted into the Quilter's Hall of Fame in 1996 and was

an Honorary Life Member of SRQG.


