Last Quiltathon of 2013 is Thursday, October 3rd

9:15 am to 3 pm at our normal meeting place.

At 10 am we will break for a brief business meeting, library report, and show-and-tell. Then we’ll continue to work and visit.

We have quilts ready to pin, machine sew, trim & turn, iron, machine quilt, and hand sew. Experienced guild members will be on hand to help any who need instruction.

We will set up tables for pinning (basting) quilts and will supply the pins.

At other tables we will have mats and rotary cutters set up for trimming quilts before they are turned.

If you’d like to sew around the edges of quilts or work on quilting, bring your machine with a walking or free-motion foot.

If you prefer to hand sew, please bring your own scissors, needles, and thimble.

The honoree must meet strict regulations to be considered, and Pam exceeds them all. To qualify, a person must have been a member for at least five years (Pam joined in 2001); must have served a full term in at least one elected position (Pam was Parliamentarian in 2003, Program Chair-Elect in 2004, Program Chair in 2005, Vice President in 2006, and President in 2007 and 2008; must have served at least one additional year in an elected office (see previous), or as a committee chair, and she served as Publicity chair in 2003, 2004, and 2005, Fair Liaison in 2004, 2005, 2009, 2010, 2011, Membership in 2012, and was our spectacular Mistress of Ceremonies at the 2013 Tri-Guild Luncheon (and I am sure that I am missing many details, so please forgive me).

there are none. Here I include the text Elaine Tucker submitted, which was signed by more than ten per cent of the guild membership:

"We nominate Pam Beebe and Anne Dondero for the Merit Award for their leadership of the Community Quilts Committee of the Santa Rosa Quilt Guild.

"*Generosity* best describes the efforts of Pam and Anne in all areas of Community Quilts.

"Pam and Anne are *generous* with their praise and encouragement to all SRQG members who participate in Community Quilts. Whether it is a beginning quilter who needs assistance in putting together a NICU kit, an experienced quilter who makes a beautiful heirloom quality quilt, or any quilter who falls between these two, Pam and Anne always have a thank you, a smile, a word of encouragement, and/or a compliment.

"Pam and Anne are *generous* with their time. For Quiltathons and Fifth Thursday Retreats, they are the first ones to arrive to set up, and the last ones to depart after take-down and clean-up. Of course, they also have the planning time before these get-togethers because they want every member of the guild to feel welcome and useful, with work for all, which includes hand sewing, ironing, pinning, and organizing, in addition to the sewing and quilting. Then there is the time spent that we never see: picking up donations; sorting donations of fabric; making and finishing quilts; sorting, packaging, coordinating deliveries; and a myriad of tasks we can only guess at.



Block of the Month

In the late 1920's, newspapers around the country began printing syndicated columns devoted to quilting, and pattern companies advertised quilt patterns for sale. Although the *Kansas City Star* patterns are the most recognized today, the *Chicago Tribune* hosted the most prolific of the quilt columnists, Elizabeth Leitner Rising, who wrote under the pen name *Nancy Cabot*. Offering patterns on a daily rather than weekly basis, Nancy Cabot published more than 2,000 designs from 1933 to 1945.



Flying Shuttles is our October Block of the Month. First published on March 17, 1937, Cabot wrote that the pattern “dates back to the early 19th century when weaving was a major household occupation in the New England states. The shuttles are apparent in a single block, and an entire quilt is one of the most strikingly beautiful examples of patchwork in existence.”

Although the original pattern was made of turkey red, white and dark red, our version of *Flying Shuttles* is green, gold and white tone-on-tone. Made of three basic elements, the block is not as complex as it may appear.

This pattern was modified from Jinny Beyer's “The Quilter's Album of Patchwork Patterns.”







Community School of Music and Arts Presents *Connecting Threads: Quilts Made at the Day Worker Center of Mountain View*

MOUNTAIN VIEW, CA – The Community School of Music and Arts (CSMA) presents **Connecting Threads: Quilts Made at the Day Worker Center of Mountain View**, featuring

quilts handcrafted by day workers at the Day Worker Center of Mountain View, as well as a "behind-the-scenes" photographic essay. The exhibition will be on display in CSMA's Mohr Gallery from Friday, October 11 through Sunday, December 1.

There will be an opening reception on Friday, October 25, from 6pm - 8pm. For four years, men and women from a variety of countries, many of them immigrants from Mexico, Central America, and South America, have been involved in quilt-making while waiting to be employed through the Day Worker Center of Mountain View. This unique show will display their work publicly for the first time. **Connecting Threads** highlights numerous quilts, each depicting personal images, stories, memories, dreams, and hopes of the day workers.

There are even quite a few members who have 20+ credits and I especially would like to encourage you to put in a request. I am available to help get your request down on paper, re-size, draft, etc.

Technique Sharing Workshops

A big "Thank you" to all the members who have generously given of their time to present a Technique Sharing Workshop this year.

We have one final one scheduled for Nov 7: Sharon Fry will be demonstrating her "Bullseye" quilt technique, which involves free form, raw-edge, "nesting" circles, with the potential for a secondary and even a tertiary quilt. Sharon has presented this technique in the past, but we have had requests from many of the new members who saw one of these quilts recently, and the rest of us would probably appreciate a refresher course.

The 2014 TSW schedule will be inaugurated on January 2 with a focus on paper foundation piecing. This will be a demo, but after the demo I will work with anyone who brings a machine and wants to try it with a small heart block. Pattern will be provided.

On January 16, Pam Beebe will be demonstrating a very slick method of sewing strips together to form a little fabric basket, which is surprisingly sturdy.

Gari Jones will be the TSW coordinator for 2014, so if you have suggestions for next year, please let her know.


