PROGRAM OCTOBER 20, 2011 ~ "ALL ABOUT APPLIQUE" WORKSHOP OCTOBER 21, 2011 ~ "AUTUMN APPLIQUE"

Cathy Van Bruggen began sewing at a very early age. She remembers sewing doll clothes by hand while watching her mother create costumes. Later, she was hired by Catalina Swimwear as a production manager and sample maker. While raising five children, she designed custom bridal wear. In 1970, they developed a family business called The Outfitters, a retail chain for women's clothing. When she retired in 1995, she began quilting as a hobby. By using timesaving techniques in quilt





making, she developed **Appliqué the Easy Way™**. She enjoys creating botanically correct appliqué featuring flowers, birds, and woodland creatures.

Her lectures is entitled "All About Appliqué". This program will include a brief history of appliqué and a trunk show of appliqué quilts. A variety of techniques will be shown to inspire you to learn how to **Appliqué the Easy Way**.

The workshop is entitled "Autumn" and is part of her "Seasons" series.

We want to have a better idea of where we are when we do the third quarter analysis at the end of September. Community Quilts

Thank you to everyone who has been helping out with Community Quilts, whether its staying after meetings to sandwich, pin or sew, to the cutting bees at Pam's house, to adopting quilts to take home and finish, and everything else that goes into making quilts to share with people in need in our community. We miss Tera's involvement (she had to step down for health and family reasons), but it has been wonderful how many of you have been willing and able to help after meetings and do anything else you can.

Bigger Quilts ...

We have had more requests for Valley of the Moon size quilts (approximately 40"x52" or longer) than we expected this year, and less demand for baby quilts than we expected, and that perhaps our needs for these will be more equal than we realized. So... if you could think of piecing or being willing to quilt some of the larger tops (we know there are a number sandwiched in the closet waiting for us), our recipients at the the Valley of the Moon, the battered women's shelter, the Sonoma Developmental Center, the Drug Abuse Alternatives Center, and the Giving Tree will be most grateful!

We've also just learned that we will have the opportunity to provide about 20 quilts to 18-year olds graduating from the foster care program this December. Last year Lavella made these quilts herself, at about 50"x60". We have a few this size already, and some more sandwiched, but if you would like to make some tops of this size, or finish some quilts this size before December, let Pam know, or watch for one at the Quiltathon to take home to finish.

We have lots of Community Quilting events in the next month, and see this as our big push before the end of the year. We hope you can join us for some or all!

Sept. 1 & 15: Guild meeting. We will have our Community Quilting Bee starting after lunch, with lots of sandwiching and pinning to get ready for the big workdays coming up. Bring your helping hands and your sewing machine if you like.

Sept. 8: Work party at Pam Beebe's home, focusing on putting together kits, and cutting donated fabric. If you want to have fun and make some new friends, RSVP and come on over: bring your cutting tools including a 4-1/2" square or 6" ruler if you have one.


