Portable Ironing Board

Materials Needed:

Lightweight, thin, flat, sturdy board (Mine is a 12" by 12" piece of plywood)

Basting Spray (I used 505)

Insul-Bright

80/20 Batting (I used leftovers from a previous quilt.)

Quilted Heat Tex solid silver/grey Fabric from Amazon (or an old thick towel*)

Fabric for the outside cover

Steps:

1. Find board

(I found mine in my husband's wood pile. The main restriction is the board needs to be able to withstand heat and steam.)

- 2. Cut Insul-Bright to size of board
- 3. Glue baste Insul-Bright to board
- 4. Cut two pieces of batting to size of board
- 5. Glue baste two pieces of batting together then baste the batting sandwich to Insul-Bright
- 6. Cut quilted Heat Tex Fabric to size of board (in Jenny Doan's video* an old thick towel was used)
- 7. Glue baste Heat Tex (or towel) to batting
- 8. For cover cut fabric (2 layers) 1/2" larger than board on all four sides
- 9. With right sides together, sew ¼" seam on three sides, then clip corners
- 10. Flip right side out and slip over board
- 11. Zig zag edge
- 12. Tuck edge under so it can be stitched
- 13. Ladder stitch tucked edge
