PROGRAM AUGUST 20, 2009 ~ CINDY NEEDHAM "THREAD FACTS AND FICTION" WORKSHOP AUGUST 21, 2009 ~ "VINTAGE LINEN WHOLECLOTH QUILTS"

Santa Rosa Quilt Guild is fortunate to have Cindy Needham as our presenter in August. Cindy has been a quilter for over 35 years and has taught for the past 10 years. Working with vintage linens has become her passion and is the topic for her book *Wholecloth Linen Quilts*. Cindy also serves as a national educator for Superior Threads, and has been the featured artist at **Road to California** as well as a guest on Ricky Tims and Alex Anderson's **The Quilt Show**. The lecture is entitled "Thread Facts and Fiction," will address the use of difficult threads, tension issues, needles and more.

The workshop, "Vintage Linen Wholecloth Quilts" will address using a piece of vintage linen to make a one-of-a-kind whole cloth quilt. Cindy will share her extensive stencil stash with attendees, who will become members of the "Linen Ladies Club."

A final note, Cindy Needham, will be presenting in the first session at Empty Spools Seminars 2010 at Asilomar. Cost for the week is \$1199, but you can learn a lot from her at our workshop which is offered for only \$35!

a quilt show in chico

Save the first weekend in October in 2009! That's when the next quilt show will be in Chico, California. I was lucky enough to catch the one this year and thoroughly enjoyed it. "Harvest of Quilts" was put on by Annie's Star Quilt Guild and, as you can figure out, is a biennial event.

Chico is a wonderful college town that straddles Chico Creek, which is bounded on both sides by Bidwell Park, one of the largest city parks in America. The land (more than 2500 acres) was donated in 1905 by Annie Bidwell and includes hiking trails, running paths, a gigantic swimming pool which the creek fills and flows through, picnic areas and other facilities for community use. California State University of Chico is based here and draws students from all over California and many other states and countries. There's a large plaza in the center of town, lots of coffee shops, book stores, antique stores, flea markets and an outstanding art glass factory called "Orient and Flume" where they blow and sell unique (and very expensive) pieces of art with nature themes. An interesting old Victorian home, the Bidwell Mansion, is worth a visit.

Annie's Star Guild (named for the above Annie, I'm sure) was formed in 1981 and currently has over 260 members. They meet the first Thursday of each month at the Masonic Center. There's a speaker at each meeting - coming up in the new year are programs by elinor peace bailey and Laura Nownes. Their community service projects include quilts for charitable fund raisers, families suffering from per-

sonal tragedies, and gifts to adopted families at Christmastime. They also make place mats that are distributed by Meals on Wheels for the needy elderly.

There are two quilt shops in Chico—The Rabbit Hole and Honey Run Quilters. They both offer classes, patterns, supplies and fabrics.

The show itself was well managed and the quilts (over 200 of them) were attractively displayed. This is the area where Kitty and Sylvia Pippen have lived (Lake Almanor), and there were many quilts there using their patterns, or by them. (One of the prize winners at the PIQF show this year was a wall quilt by Sylvia Pippen.) I'm always drawn to their work. It's so clean and perfect and eye pleasing. The show's featured quilter was a local woman, Cathy Lynch, who worked for many years as an Interior Designer until she started quilting. She specializes in Art Quilts, taking traditional designs and using unique fabrics and painting on them. A very talented woman!

So mark this on your calendar - it's a lovely trip to Chico, especially this time of year. Stay overnight and spend a day exploring the area. A fun place to visit.

Now it's time to use my fabric. I'm searching in a mad dash. I can't remember where I put them. Where did I hide my stash!?


After days of searching I found it. But it's far too beautiful to cut, I'm off to the quilt shop to buy more, Help! Will I ever get out of this rut?
