**New Business:** Drug Abuse Alternative Center (DAAC) Co-Ordinator Kathy Peters was introduced. She thanked the guild for their generous support of the young women who are in the DAAC treatment program as well as the guild's support of their young children.

She noted that the ABCD workshop has nothing to do with the alphabet but is, in fact, a how-to on making 32 different blocks and how to design a quilt with them. <u>TSW</u>: Today's TSW with Diana Roberts involves using felted wool in quilts. The Feb. 19 TSW will have Pam McVey showing how to include a flange into binding.

<u>Community Outreach</u> – Myrna Estes showed hats that are handed out to Veterans and scarves that go to Veterans and school children.

<u>Community Quilts</u> - Anne Dondero noted that in 2014 we donated 1,527 quilts and since 1984 our number is 18,836 quilts. We received a thank you from Family Services for the quilts donated to foster care kids who are aging out of the system. These were presented by Diana Roberts. The committee now includes the following: new member Janet Tonkin washing and storing flannel, Susan Hazelwood storing completed quilts and delivering, Marlene Sullivan collecting doll quilts throughout the year and distributing, Lavella Cassinelli continuing with her mini group in making quilts for Veterans, and Laura Barrett and Nancy Stedman will run 5<sup>th</sup> Thursday retreats and quiltathons.

Nancy Stedman noted that this month there will be a 5<sup>th</sup> Thursday retreat at the Luther Burbank Art & Garden Center and invited all to join in. The next quilt-a-thon is Feb. 5 - bring a machine if you want to sew/quilt or choose from many other jobs that need doing.

#### Quilt Challenge

Pam McVey announced the new quilt challenge: "My Favorite Destination". There are no size limits and the due date is August 6<sup>th</sup>. If you have questions, see Pam.

<u>Opportunity Quilt Tickets</u> Lynette Whitman, during the introduction of committee members noted that to date we have made \$4,000 on our current opportunity quilt. Also helping her with the Opportunity Quilt are Pat Kearns, Dianne Cheli, and Glenda Ross.
