Community Quilts – Anne Dondero reminded us that no more flannel is needed so do not bring in flannel from Joann's after Thanksgiving sale. We are still collecting doll quilts through to our next meeting. These will be delivered to the Salvation Army, Welfare League, and Community Child Care Council. If they have flannel on the back, batting is not necessary.

Community Outreach – Mirna Estes showed a blanket she put together with a strap for shoulder carrying. Also, she has scarves she will be taking to elementary school children; Lavella Cassinelli is co-ordinating quilts for Veterans with a group of assistants.

Opportunity Quilt – Patricia Kearns noted that the Guild asks members to buy \$20 worth of Opportunity Quilt tickets. We will be selling tickets at Meissner Sewing & Vacuum on Nov. 27 & 28 and Dec. 4 & 5 and need volunteers to work 1½ hour shifts each day. Patricia also showed a ticket presentation holder useful for when you give the tickets as gifts.
