#### **Quilt Related Announcements**

<u>Valley Fire Quilt Fest</u> – Jan Westerman reminded the membership that this Quilt Fest will take place on Thursday, January 14<sup>th.</sup> This will not be in the format of the Guild Quiltathons for Community Quilts. There will be no work stations. This is an opportunity for interested members to bring their own quilts/supplies and gather together to work on the quilts to be donated. Jan committed SRQG to providing 30 quilts at a minimum. The size should be 60 x 70" or larger. If you have smaller quilts, you can offer them to Broadway Quilts. Finished quilts can be given to Jan Nilsen and quilt tops can be given to Jan Westerman. The completed quilts are due to be turned over to Kerrie at Kerrie's Quilting on Feb. 4. If you need batting, some will be available and possibly some quilt backs as well. Judith Clarke offered the use of 'orphan blocks' for putting quilt tops together – see her. Norma Viglienzone has offered to provide Minestrone soup for lunch.
