Mystery Quilt 2019

With Joanie Bellinghausen

There will be 12 featured blocks. They can be fun printed fabric, panel fabric, or embroidery. The featured fabric blocks will be cut to 8 1/2"square. If you embroidery your blocks make them bigger then 8 1/2". Will square them up later.

We will also have 3 contrasting fabric. High contrast is recommended because these fabrics will be next to each other.

Fabrics:

Feature 1 Yard
Background 1 3/4 Yards (This fabric will run throughout the quilt)
Coordinate A 3/4 Yards
Coordinate B 3/4 Yard (High contrast between A and B)

I have allowed 1/4 yard extra fabric to this list in case of errors The finished quilt top is 48" 56".

If you want to add borders, the first border is 5/8 Yards of Coordinate B and last border will be 1 1/4 Yards of your choice.



This is my choice of fabrics.

Step 1

Cut 4 Strips of Background Fabric ~ 2 1/2" by Width of Fabric.

Cut 1 Strip of Coordinate Fabric A~ 2 1/2" by Width of Fabric.

Cut 1 Strip of Coordinate Fabric B ~ 2 1/2" by Width of Fabric.

Sew Strips as in Picture with the Coordinate Fabric in the Middle.



Step 2
Cut Sewn Strips 2 1/2" Wide
You Will Have ~9~ Rectangles From
Each Strip. Should Measure
2 1/2" x 6 1/2"



Cutting Instructions

Step 3

Cut 2 Strips 6 1/2" by Width of Fabric of Coordinate ~A~ Sub Cut 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" for 30 (Should get 15 per Strip)


Cut 2 Strips 6 1/2" by Width of Fabric of Coordinate ~ B~ Sub Cut 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" for 30 (Should get 15 per Strip)

Step 4

Back Ground Fabric
Cut 2 Strips 4 1/2" by Width of Fabric
Sub Cut 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" (Should get 18)

Cut 3 Strips 8 1/2" by Width of Fabric Sub Cut 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" (Should get 21)

Cut 42 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" Squares (I Used Leftovers From the Other Background Strips of Fabric From Above)



Making the Quilt Blocks

First off name your coordinate fabrics A and B and paste them here. A B

Sew a coordinate A, 2 1/2" x 6 1/2", to the strata piece that you made a head of time with B fabric in the middle.

Now do the same with coordinate B, 2 1/2" x 6 1/2", to the strata piece with A fabric in the middle. Make nine each and press to the coordinate fabric.



Now sew background fabric, 2 1/2" x 4 1/2", to the bottom of block A. Make 9 and press toward the background fabric. Do the same for block B but sew the background fabric to the top of block. Sew block together.

This



Sew a, 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" square to each of the 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" coordinates A and B on one side only. Make 21 of each and press to the background fabric.



Now sew a, 4 1/2" x 8 1/2", to the middle of the strips that you just made. Refer to picture. 9 going in one direction and 12 going in the opposite direction. Press to background fabric. This is block 2.





Sew rows together. First row will have 3 feature fabric blocks and 3 block 2s for a total of 6 blocks.

Next row is 3, block 2s and 3, block 1s. You will have a total of 7 rows.
