- 3. Approval of the 2021 SRQG Budget.

The Committee has donated quilts to Sutter NICU, Memorial Hospital NICU, Emancipated Youth, and Public Health. The Committee is also working to collect 100 quilts for Valley of the Moon Children's Home.

Jan Andrews gave a live Zoom report for Membership, and displayed all six of Linda Hooper's raffle gifts. Two prizes will be raffled on November 5th, November 19th, and December 3rd for members whose dues are collected from the Post Office Box on that day.
