programs & workshops

PROGRAM FEBRUARY 19, 2009 ~ JUDY MULLEN ~ "QUILTS, THEN AND NOW"



Our featured speaker for February 2009 is Judy Mullen. She has had a lifelong love affair with fabrics and has been teaching sewing and quilting for over 25 years. She was a designer in the 2007 Bernina Fashion Show "Diamond Odyssey". Her sewing skills have been recognized with Crème de la Crème Award at the 2006 Bernina Fashion Show "Magnifique" (her first time as a designer), a First Place award in 2006, Viewer's Choice and Second Place Award in 2004, and a Second Place Award in the 2002 Hobbs Fashion Contest at the American Quilt Society Show in Paducah, KY, Best in Show 2007, 1st Place and Best Fabric Manipulation 2005 and 2008 at Road to California, and many other Judge's

Choice and Viewer's Choice awards.

Judy is a charter and life member of Manteca Quilters. She has served as President and Quilt Show Chair three times. She is a founder and chairperson of the Central Valley Wearable Artists. She is also a board member and Assistant Director of the Northern California Quilt Council. Judy teaches and lectures at guilds throughout California.

This proud grandmother of four lives in Manteca, enjoys teaching and present trunk shows of her wearables and quilts, and motor home travel with her golfing husband of 42 years and Scooter "The Wonder Cocker".

Workshop February 20, 2009 ~ "More Than a Vest"

"More Than A Vest" is the name of her workshop. Her vest pattern was inspired by an old Vogue pattern. She completely redesigned and redrafted the pattern. If a participant needs an X-small or XXXL the pattern can be drafted and altered during the workshop. Yes, the pattern can be lengthened, too. The vest does not come in a sleeveless version. The vest has bound seams, the female part of the snap is hidden and the male part is covered in fabric, the inside of the vest has a small pocket and the edges are finished with a binding which is completely applied by machine. Flannel is used as the batting in the vest. Sign-ups are still open for this workshop, see the display at the back of the meeting room.



The workshop will be held at Luther Burbank Art & Garden Center, 2050 Yulupa Ave., Santa Rosa.



coming in march

Andi's quilt "Branching Out", (which features dog-



(which features dogwood blossoms) won best art quilt at Houston in 2006 and was in the 40 art quilts in 2007 accepted into 100,000 challenge. She is teaching at Asilomar in April.

She focuses on design elements mixed with appliqué for her "Make Your Own Garden Workshop."

Students can either fuse or hand or machine appliqué the project, however, she doesn't spend time teaching machine appliqué. Students are encouraged to bring enough varied fabrics for their projects; fat quarters are good. Students play with paper and scissors the first hour of the workshop, and get their design put together.

I will have her supply list and a story board about her workshop at our January meeting.

It sounds like all levels will enjoy this class.


And the following books have been donated by Nancy Parmelee. Many of her books we already have in our library, so look for the duplicates on our Silent Auction Table over the next few meetings.
