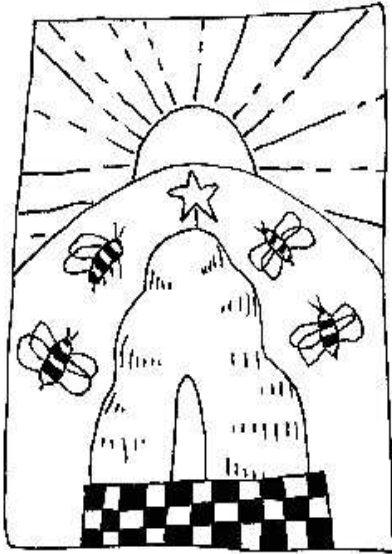

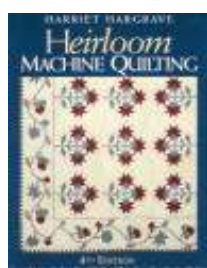

32" x 40" Baby Quilts	For Sutter & Memorial Hospital NICUs, Public Health nursing & teen moms. We provide kits for making the tops, or use your own fabrics
50" x 65"	For 18 year olds aging out of the Foster Care System
40" x 60"	Lap quilts for adults. Given to Secret Santa, deserving seniors in local convalescent hospitals & others.
Doll Quilts	For little girls and boys. We collect these all year and donate during the holidays.

QUILTY PLEAURES STUDIO

I am a 5th generation Santa Rosa gal and have been sewing since my teens. I started quilting 12 years ago and will never stop because I love the energy of a group of talented quilters.

I came out of retirement from the Sacramento Fire Department to work on a dream job that has been in the back of my mind for years. I decided to open a longarm quilting studio two years ago. I took advantage of a local business course for entrepreneurs and by the end of the course I had my studio under construction. I did an extensive amount of research during my business course and found that most longarm quilters in this area were "self taught." I didn't want to be self taught; I wanted a good solid education that would help me start strong with my new company. Mentor Barbara Youngblood agreed with the idea and before I knew it I was registered at MQX Quilt Festival in Portland, Oregon. I took every class I could from dawn to dusk. As a result I have learned from some of the country's best longarm professionals such as Linda Taylor, Irena Bluhm, Claudia Pfeil, Jerry Granata! I then returned to California and continued my education with Master Longarmer Laura Lee Fritz. Later, Marion Drain of Cuddle Time quilts taught me how to work with difficult quilts and stencils.

Six months after all of this training and education I realized I needed a computerized longarm if I was going to work full time with a serious back injury, and that was the single best decision I have made! I continue to take classes and private lessons in an attempt to master my Gammill with a Statler Stitcher. Currently Deb Covington, a Gammill beta tester and instructor mentors me with the computerized aspect and am excited to join with her in a international Statler Stitcher Retreat with T.J. Speiser and Georgia Stull! This will be the best of the best as far as instruction goes and I am very excited!


I have a fun studio in Geyserville called Quilty Pleasures. It is where I do my longarm quilting and have groups for quilting projects. By the time you read this I will be celebrating my 8th month anniversary! With SRQG's support I have kept very busy and have made many, many, new friends!

Do take the beautiful drive to Geyserville to come say "Hi"!

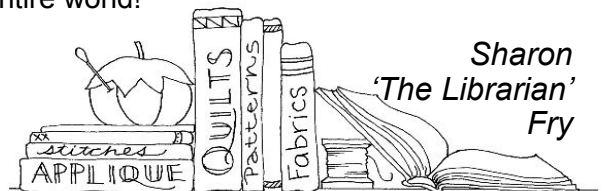

Needle and Thread

Carolle LeMonnier

If you could bottle champagne in an apron, you'd have to name it after our bubbly hostess in charge of hospitality, Carolle LeMonnier.

With lots of waitressing experience in her past, Carolle says that hospitality is a natural fit for her. Along with her dedicated

team of Georgiann Morrissey, Edy Sorensen and Judy Lindberg, Carolle treats us to the best that pot lucks can offer ... and she creates a fine repast out of disparate dishes at every guild meeting ... AND she *does the dishes!*

Carolle started quilting in 1992 when her mother-in-law gave up on sewing and gave her an old Sears Kenmore sewing machine. In gratitude, Carolle made her first quilt, a pink sampler quilt, that Carolle says is one of the ugliest quilts she's made. Remembering that quilt, Carolle appreciates that she is a much better quilter today.

She went for king size on her next quilt – a black, green, red and white “Card Trick” – and she figured if you make the pattern big enough it won't take as much time. She still has this quilt, and brings it out every Christmas as another reminder of how much her quilting has improved.

Carolle's third quilt was another disaster, a “Log Cabin” that she started in a class, but chose to make it of polyester fabrics. She still has the pieces of it around but has no desire to finish it ... another reminder.

Always thinking big, she declared herself fearless and made more king sized quilts including a “Double Wedding Ring,” and a “Mariner's Compass.” Not only did she piece them herself, but she did her own quilting on a Bernina, and a Brother as well. Carolle briefly dabbled in “art quilts” but never felt it was a good expression for her.

Not realizing there were other quilters out there, let alone that there are stores that cater specifically to quilters, Carolle found the store and guild that sponsors the “Road to California” quilt show in Ontario, CA. She's been hooked ever since.

So why quilting? Carolle loves waking up in the morning and the first thing she sees in the intricacy of thread and fabric. She has always loved the design of quilts, the symmetry and engineering of pattern. She is inspired by everyday items and sees potential quilts in nature, light patterns or common items like ceramic tiles.

Once a world traveler (her son lives in Egypt) Carolle has had the opportunity to buy fabric in every continent except Antarctica.

Carolle likes all of it ... appliqué, piecing, paper piecing, hand work, machine quilting ... all of it.

She has no color preference, but has the tendency to lose interest on projects that take too long. As we all know, she doesn't do subtle or “girlie-girlie.”

Carolle moved to Northern California in 2005. With a very understanding husband, she converted the master bedroom (the biggest room in the house) into her sewing studio. In 2007, she and her good friend, Georgiann Morrissey, decided to check out the SRQG and joined during their very first meeting. They have been working together in hospitality for 5 years; with Edy and Judy, they have a great team and have lots of fun.

She is looking forward to completing a baby quilt for her soon to be granddaughter. Carolle loves going to retreats, and welcomes any new challenge the quilting world can offer her. She's currently working on a quilt someone else made by hand, and Carolle's been trying to finish it for the past 10 years. That's her retreat project.

We are so fortunate that Carolle LeMonnier found her way to the Santa Rosa Quilt guild; if she hadn't, we'd all starve! Not really, but we sure wouldn't have as much fun!

The Finley exhibit will be followed immediately by an exhibit at Sprint Copy Center – September 15-October 31. More information follows in the September newsletter!

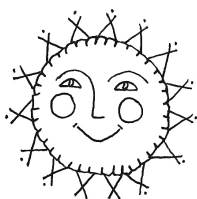

Helping Hands in Haiti

We recently received an email from a school in Haiti appealing for help with supplies for their vocational program. The purpose of the program is to give the students a skill that could raise them out of poverty, and contribute goods and services to their community.

The concept of the school has been in the works for some time, but the actual classes have just begun. In June a class started with 10 girls from the village that will teach them how to sew on treadle. They will be learning to control the machines, make pin-cushions, drawstring bags, and eventually PJ shorts. This is being viewed as a summer program.

The other big part of the school started the first week of July. It is a sewing center intending to train seamstresses in the area. They will be trained on the 3 electric machines currently owned by the school. They will be making 5 different high-end bag patterns. A volunteer who has run factories in Puerto Rico and Orlando, and is very talented at both sewing and running a production line, is guiding them. The hope is to create jobs in the village, and expand the school. Eventually these bags will be imported and sold in the US. They are making these bags in beautiful earth tones and they feel very certain these bags will do very well and have the potential to grow into a serious operation that could affect many families in this community. When I asked them what is the one thing the guild could send that would help them immediately they said they could use polyester thread in BLUE, WHITE, KHAKI and BLACK. I will update the Guild as soon as they have a better idea of fabric specifics and other supplies they might need, but in the meantime all of your thread donations will be well received.

There is no way to send a package of supplies to Haiti directly so we have to be careful to send only what is requested. Those supplies will be hand delivered by the volunteers from Florida as they go down to oversee the school's progress.

This is a small school and we can collectively make a big difference. I have had so many people approach me with an open heart just waiting to hear how they can contribute. I will keep you posted with this fast moving and evolving program.
