

32" x 40" Baby Quilts	For Sutter & Memorial NICUs, Public Health nursing, & teen moms. We provide kits for making the tops, or you may use your own fabrics.
40" x 60"	For Valley of the Moon and other organizations serving children in need. Please use bright colors for young children or fabrics that will appeal to teenagers.
50" x 65"	For 18 year olds aging out of the Foster Care system and for women residing at the YWCA Safe House.
40" x 60"	Lap quilts for adults. Given to Secret Santa, women being served by Verity, deserving seniors in local convalescent hospitals, & others.
Doll Quilts	For little girls & boys. We collect them throughout the year and donate during the holidays.

## Georgiann Morrissey

Georgiann Morrissey and her sisters learned to sew early in life. Her mother taught her how to sew her own clothes, and introduced her to quilting through Kay Wood's "Six Hour Strip Quilt" (which took her a lot longer than six hours). Georgiann learned a wide variety of needlecraft including cross stitch and needlepoint. She finds great satisfaction working with her hands on a tactile hobby. Not one to spend hours sitting and reading, she likes to keep herself busy. She became fascinated with the potential of quilting and started taking classes 14 years ago; Georgiann has been quilting ever since.

Her favorite part of quilting is the piecing process, working out the math, and figuring out how the patterns and piecing come together. She has done some appliqué, but finds the time it takes can make her too complacent.

Preferring bright fabrics rather than earth tones, Georgiann's palette leans towards batiks, Japanese prints and novelty fabrics. You won't find '30's or Reproduction small prints in her stash. Speaking of stash, Georgiann keeps it very small and prefers to buy fabric for specific projects. She likes to use what is left over to make Community quilts.

When Georgiann's mother moved to Arizona, she joined a guild and made hundreds of small quilts for the local pregnancy center. That connection with her mother stays with her to this day. Even though her memory is failing, her mother always asks about her current quilt projects and loves seeing them ... a very personal bond that spans the vagaries of age. Georgiann is very grateful for SRQG ... all the talented artists and positive energy. It always feels good to share time together at our meetings, and she especially likes the energies that go into making community quilts.

Georgiann received the Merit Award in 2014 for graciously sharing Hospitality tasks with Carolle LeMonnier, Edy Sorenson, Judy Lindberg, and other volunteers. She has always enjoyed serving food, and loves the camaraderie around sharing food. Again, not one to enjoy sitting, it keeps her hands busy and fulfills another of her passions which is to help promote good cheer among friends.

Unlike so many of us, Georgiann lays claim to having only three UFO's; she likes to finish what she starts, and plans on completing at least one of those UFO's (a Christmas tree skirt) before the holidays.


I recently arranged with Village Sewing to display the quilt and sell tickets, something they are pleased to do. The quilt will return to guild for Founders' Day Luncheon.


