President's Message

I am so grateful that I may continue to explore "retirement" and pursue projects and pleasures that were not available to me during my working days. One of the first major paybacks (other than not having to wear a watch anymore) was the joy and friendship offered to me by the Santa Rosa Quilt Guild. I used to be the lone dining room quilter for so many years, and had no concept of the wonderful benefits that are available through being an active member in a quilt guild.

Another notable discovery has been the mental escapades that are offered by our great Sonoma County Library system. While working, I probably hadn't read more than one or two books a year, if that ... I didn't even own a library card. Now our household is going through three or four books a week, and we enjoy our regular trips to the Rincon Valley Library.

During a recent visit, the library featured a display of "Books You Should Read Before You Die." Of course, there was "David Copperfield," "Ulysses," "The Count of Monte Cristo," and many more. I picked up a copy of "The Catcher in the Rye" by J. D. Salinger and realized that even if I had read it in college, I had no idea what it was about. So I read it ... and I still don't have any idea what it was about, other than the adventures of a 20-something aimless young man, written in his voice. I understand why the book might be attractive to someone of that age, but it didn't do much for me. That's why the library offers such a great collection of books to read; something for everyone.

To become better informed about what our library offers, I am pleased to announce that Jennifer Duran, Branch Manager of the Rincon Valley Library, will give a brief presentation to SRQG during our meeting on Thursday, July 7.

"As the branch manager at the Rincon Valley Library, I am very interested in meeting with groups out in the service community around Rincon Valley Library. In brief, I would like to share what many library patrons are sharing as their key or most important services they would like to see developed further or currently enjoy at their public library.

"Sonoma County Library is very keen on collecting even more community feedback from as many of our library users as we can. Through the process of collecting feedback, we are finding that we are reminding our community members about many of the library services we are already offering that they have yet to take full advantage of.

"[I appreciate having] an opportunity to allow your members to ask questions about services the public library offers, and [will] leave a feedback form for Guild members to fill out if they are willing to do so. I also will briefly share how the library is funded because many of our patrons do not understand the library budget. That is yet another goal, to educate the community at large on library funding because it is a common question that is asked of the library staff and commonly misunderstood." – Jennifer Duran, Branch Manager, Rincon Valley Library.

As we head into the height of summer, it's likely to be too hot to be sewing on that flannel Christmas quilt for your grandchild, so why not get into the habit of checking out what is available at your local library? Find that cozy corner inside or a shady nook out in your garden, grab your favorite cold beverage, and expand your imagination to another world. While you're at it, be sure to plan a trip to the library when SRQG or "Pointless Sisters" have the opportunity to hang quilts in the main hall. What a great way to share our art with the Sonoma County community!

We are very fortunate to have Cindy back for a two day workshop on machine quilting. Cindy is an award winning quilter who has written many articles, published a book on Wholecloth Linen Quilts, has

appeared on "The Quilt Show" with Alex and Ricky, and has classes on Craftsy. She has also developed wonderful stencil tools that allow one to design any quilting pattern based on either a circle or a square.



As Cindy says:

" One of the best loved quilting designs of all times is the

feather and it seems to be one of the more difficult ones to beautifully quilt. I LOVE to quilt feathers and I enjoy making them my own by adding special touches and details. I also enjoy filling my open spaces with beautifully detailed background designs. It's usually a beautiful background that provides the "WOW" factor to a quilt."

She will be teaching us how to make beautiful feather designs on the first day. The second day will be learning to use her "Ultimate Stencils" how to make your own designs for any project as well as beautiful background fillers. Of course, there will be lots of sewing and the opportunity to work on your own project as well. This is a wonderful opportunity to improve on machine quilting skills with one on one coaching from an amazing quilter and teacher. As she brings many supplies there is a class kit fee of \$15 with unlimited use of Superior threads. **SANDRA BRUCE** August 18 & 19, 2016

Sandra is a quilt artist who lives in Grass Valley, CA and has been teaching and operating her own longarm business since 2010. She combines her love of lettering and illustration into her quilts and loves to incorporate writing into her quilting motifs. She is known for her portraits in fab-



ric and her use of color. "Material Matrix", which involves interpreting a gridded photograph with fabric is a process that is different than other gridded photograph methods in that it involves piecing and a loose, representational style inspired by the painter, Chuck Close.

August 18 Program

"Trunk Show"

Sandra will do a lecture and trunk show that showcases her work, her background, and the road that led lead her to develop her "material matrix" technique which can be seen on her website. She will also be talking about use of color.

August 19 Workshop

"Color Dance"

A fun wonky and colorful log cabin quilt. She will be teaching the design the curved border pattern and colorful pieced border. She will be focusing on the use of color and value and recommends students bring fabrics in the color families on the quilt. This is a great



stash busting project for all those fabrics you can't part with but don't know what to do with. The finished quilt is 70"x 70."

Fair Liaison

There are still opportunities to sign up to demonstrate quilting during the Sonoma County Fair. There will be two machines to use and kits to make baby quilts if you want to, or you can also bring your own project to work on. This is a fun way to get acquainted with fellow guild members and share our love of quilting with fairgoers. You will receive a pass to the fair for each shift you work. I'll have the sign up sheets with me at all meetings throughout the fair.
