

Santa Rosa Quilt Guild

Block-of-the-Month

July 2023 <mark>Triple Star"</mark>

This block will be a great use for that red, white, and blue fabric in your stash. Of course, a variety of prints makes a more interesting quilt!

Fabric (Photo 2):

Background: **BLUE**

4 ea. 3-1/2" squares

16 ea. 2-1/2" squares

Assorted **RED** and **WHITE** prints:

8 ea. 5-1/2" X 2-1/2" rectangles

4 ea. 3-1/2" X 2-1/2" rectangles

1 ea. 2-1/2" square



Cutting and Marking Instructions:

- 1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of all blue squares. Place a marked square on one end of a 3-1/2" X 2-1/2" rectangle. right sides together with the line on the square going up from left to right. Repeat for the three remaining rectangles to make a total of four units. Sew on the line and trim the seam to 1/4". Press to the darker fabric. (Photo 3)
- 2. Sew a blue 3-1/2" square to each unit from step 1 with the longer color side attaching to the square. (Photo 4)
- 3. Place a marked square on one end of the 5-1/2" X 2-1/2" rectangle, right sides together with the line on the square going down from left to right as in step 1. Repeat for the 3 more rectangles. Make 4. Sew on the line and trim the seam to 1/4". Press. (Photo 5)
- 4. Sew a unit from step 3 to the right edge of each unit from step 2. Make 4. (Photo 6)
- 5. As in step 1, sew 8 blue squares on opposite ends of 5-1/2" X 2-1/2" rectangles right sides together. With the piece horizontal, the lines should go down from left to right. Stitch on the line and trim the seam to 1/4" and press to one side. Make 4. (Photo 7)

- 6. At this point lay all the units out in the completed pattern for the block. Then proceed. (Photo 8)
- 7. Sew two of the units from step 5 to opposite sides of the 2-1/2" print square in the center. Press seams. (Photo 8)
- 8. Sew one step 2 unit to each side of one step 5 unit. The larger blue square is always on the outside corner.
- 9. Repeat step 8 for the remaining 3 units, joining step 2 and step 5 units.
- 10. Assemble the sections. Press so the center square seams are flat. (Photo 1)

Write your name on an inside seam and you will be entered in the drawing for the blocks at our first September meeting.
