PROGRAM JULY 16, 2009 ~ NANCY PINKSTON

### "SQUARE IN A SQUARE QUILTING METHOD"

### WORKSHOP JULY 17, 2009 ~ "SQUARE IN A SQUARE TECHNIQUE"



Nancy Pinkston uses the Square in a Square®, a new technique for rotary cutting and strip piecing that allows guilters to achieve perfect points with improved accuracy, simplicity of construction, and speed. The resulting

blocks go together with great ease and lie very flat. For those of you struggling with half square triangles - take this workshop.

The presentation is the "Square in a Square Quilting Method". Nancy will be demonstrating the Square in a

Square method of quilt making, created by Jodi Barrows.

We have a supply list and sewing requirements for the workshop. Nancy will also have a kit with the same fabrics as the sample, if anyone is interested. The kit has all the pieces for the quilt top cut and ready to sew and sells for \$7. Nancy will give a 15% discount on all of Jodi Barrow's Square in a Square products purchased at the program and workshop. Please note: The SnS Ruler is one of the workshop requirements, and it regularly sells for \$19.95 plus, however, with the discount and new tax, it will cost only \$18.55.





# coming in august

Santa Rosa Quilt Guild is fortunate to have Cindy Needham as our presenter in August. Cindy has been a quilter for over 35 years and has taught for the past 10 years. Working with vintage linens has become her passion and is the topic for book Wholecloth her Linen Quilts. Cindy also serves as a national edu-



cator for Superior Threads, and has been the featured artist at **Road to California** as well as a guest on Ricky Tims and Alex Anderson's "**The Quilt Show**."

The lecture is entitled "Thread Facts and Fiction," will address the use of difficult threads, tension is-



sues, needles and more.

The workshop, "Vintage Linen Wholecloth Quilts" will address using a piece of vintage linen to make a one-of-a-kind whole cloth quilt. Cindy will share her extensive

stencil stash with attendees, who will become members of the "Linen Ladies Club."

A final note, Cindy Needham, will be presenting in the first session at Empty Spools Seminars 2010 at Asilomar . Cost for the week is \$1199, but you can learn a lot from her at our workshop which is offered for only \$35!
